Call for Papers

Dear Colleagues,

The *Review of International Organizations* will publish a special issue on "Domestic Politics and International Organizations." We invite submissions for consideration to be in the special issue.

The special issue addresses the following themes: International Organizations (IOs) are closely intertwined with their members' domestic political systems in an ongoing two-way relationship. Voters and interest groups engage with domestic politicians through national institutions to shape policies toward IOs. In turn, IOs make decisions that impinge upon domestic politics, policy, and institutions. The purpose of this special issue is to develop more systematic ways of analyzing the two-way relationship between domestic politics and international organizations. We encourage papers that address the following questions: What are the domestic political and institutional foundations of international organizations? How are shocks to these foundations transmitted to IOs, and how, in turn, do IOs modify their behavior in light of changes in domestic politics? What channels and mechanisms convey information about domestic politics to IOs, and from IOs to domestic politics? Do international organizations have the agency to shape domestic politics to their advantage? We encourage theoretical and empirical contributions on domestic politics and IOs in any issue area where IOs are present.

The deadline for submissions is September 15, 2023. Submissions should be made through Editorial Manager (http://www.editorialmanager.com/roio/), indicating that the submission is to the special issue ("SI: Domestic Politics and IOs").
